Man Blinded by a Very Bright Light



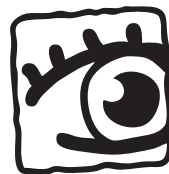
On the busy highway to Damascus today, it was reported that a very bright light in the middle of the day blinded a man. No other news
